

"INDIAN RULERS"

"Mardi Gras Indians have been parading in costume, or "masking" since the 1860's at a place in New Orleans called Congo Square where slaves were formerly sold. African men and native Americans came together, both shared traditions of ritual dancing with communal chants and ceremonial dress. Following emancipation in 1863, sightings of freed black men parading in full Indian dress became increasingly common. "There's a lot of old traditional music that came down' says Bo Dollis "I just made mine commercial" referring to the ground breaking events that occurred in 1970 which led to a revolution in Mardi Gras Indian music. Quint Davis, founder of New Orleans Jazzfest, promoted a concert featuring Bo Dollis and the Wild Magnolias & a funk band led by keyboardist Willie Tee, leading to the first time the Indians ventured into the studio recording "Handa Wanda". The song became an instant New Orleans classic & touched off the funkification of Mardi Gras Indian music which continues to this day"
